- i. SANJAY GUPTA & ORS Vs. STATE OF U.P. & ORS In WRIT PETITION (CIVIL) NO. 338 OF 2006, authored by Hon'ble Justice Mr. Dipak Misra and Hon'ble Justice Mr. V. Gopala Gowda, Judges Supreme Court of India;
- ii. BAIRAM MURALIDHAR Vs. STATE OF A.P.in CRIMINAL APPEAL NO. 1587 OF 2014 (Arising out of S.L.P. (Crl.) 1487 of 2012, authored by Hon'ble Justice Mr. Dipak Misra and Hon'ble Justice Mr. Pinaki Chandra Ghose, Judges Supreme Court of India;

Taking this as the choice, one shall start inculcating the art of imbibing the values and virtues of these sublime reservoirs of knowledge of law in its many facets, including the law on first principles, the art of reaching at decisions in the light of the submissions made on both sides.
